Key Components:

- Accountability Groups or three or four people.
- Personal Devotions Prayer, How to read the Bible.
- Clear understanding of salvation and how to articulate the plan of salvation.
- Your New Spiritual Identity, security, walking in the Spirit
- An understanding of the Seven Basic teachings of Jesus (repentance, baptism, prayer, The Great Commandment, The Great Commission, Communion, giving).

Short Term Results:

- Commitment to Accountability
- Daily habit of prayer and Bible reading
- Ability to share the Gospel effectively to a lost person
- Know who you are in Christ and walk in the Spirit
- Able to lead a Basic Training Group, alone or with a mentor.

Long Term Results

- First step towards leadership training.
- Take the next step into more in-depth discipleship or leadership training.

Your Commitment

- Eight weekly meetings In person or on-line.
- Listen to one audio message each week. These will be provided.
- Daily Bible reading according to schedule.
- Participation in one weekend service each week.
- Openness to the possibility of God calling **you** to pass on what you learn!

- That means this is something that happens one time.
- You don't get justified every day, or once a week, or each time you confess sins.
- You get justified on the day you say yes to Jesus and believe.

Romans 5:1-2

- Not only are we justified by grace through faith, we also stand....
- Through Christ- we also have access by faith to the grace to stand.

Galatians 3:3

- Paul says, look, it starts with faith, it finishes with faith.
- We accept that God forgives what we did before we were saved....

Listen, there are a lot of reasons to not sin:

- Let's not add to all the other consequences you may have brought on yourself the idea that God cannot forgive you!
- Today's message is that you will never overcome bondage in your life if you don't know where you stand with God.
- If you don't have peace with God, you will never have any other kind of peace.
